

# Walk 1 - River Whitewater and Greywell Moors

## 45 Minutes

Beginning at the Fox and Goose, turn right and walk down The Street past the village hall on the right with its flag pole. Continue on until you reach the church lychgate on the left and then walk up the gravel path to the Church of St Mary the Virgin. Just before reaching the porch turn right and follow the path through the churchyard to the reed beds by the River Whitewater and then on to a boardwalk that winds through an area of tall herbage. After about 150 metres the path turns slightly away from the riverbank and follows the edge of a field towards the Mill House.



Then cross left in front of the Mill House and over the River Whitewater in front of the mill wheel and follow the eastern bank of the 'Mill Head' pond. Eventually turn left away from the bank edge to cross an area of hazel and willow scrub finally meeting up with a second path by a barrier next to an ash tree. Turn left and follow the bridleway between the hazel trees and the hedge until you come to a field gate. Pass by this into a long field, which runs parallel to the River Whitewater for over half a mile down towards the Water Works off Deptford Lane.

About 3/4 of the way along the field there is a path off to the left that runs down through the trees to cross the river by a small concrete footbridge known as 'Toll's Bridge'. Passing over the river you walk up to the field through a short 'avenue' flanked by three ancient pollarded lime trees. On clearing the V-point, turn left to join a footpath across the field to a kissing gate at the edge of the churchyard, then return to the Fox and Goose along the main road.
